Under Missouri Revised Statute Chapter 595.209, Victims' rights are granted automatically to all victims of dangerous felony crimes. If you were a victim of a non-dangerous, felony crime, or a victim of any misdemeanor crime, you <u>must request in writing</u> that your rights be observed. Mail your requests to:
